

What are we?

The Bunbury Museum + Heritage Centre is a new museum, focusing on education, enjoyment and research for all visitors.

Bunbury has a rich history as a maritime city, the regional capital of South West Western Australia.

What do we do?

The Bunbury Museum + Heritage Centre use stories and objects to excite our visitors' imaginations and share the exciting tales that have made this city unique.

Our education programs are designed in line with the West Australian Curriculum (SCaSA), to maximise the benefits of school visits across several areas of the curriculum.

Visitors may be self-guided or book tours with our enthusiastic team members to take a step back in time.

What programs do we offer?

School Days

The Museum is located in a beautifully restored 1886 building which was a school for 75 years. We have an old-style classroom with stories from the past students, and we re-create those days for visiting schools.

Shipwrecks & Whalers


A unique feature of the city's rich history are the stories of the characters who sailed the world's oceans, coming to Western Australia for trade, and sometimes ending up wrecked on Bunbury's shoreline.

Picture My World – Mapping

Maps are fascinating documents – whether they picture the world of a child or an ocean navigator. We can introduce your students to maps and the world they reveal.

Where are we?

The Bunbury Museum + Heritage Centre is located in the Paisley Centre building on the corner of Arthur Street and Stephen Street.



What do you need to know?

Parking

The Bunbury Museum + Heritage Centre is next to the Centrepunkt shopping centre and there are three car parks adjacent or in close walking distance. There are six ACROD bays adjacent to the Museum building. Outside the front of the Museum is a drop off area.

Toilets

The Museum has male, female and disabled toilets within the building. Public facilities are also available on the outside of the building.

Disabled access

The Museum has good disabled access and programs are being developed with visitors with disabilities in mind. An adult-sized wheelchair is available for free use by visitors. Visitors accompanied by a Trained Guide or Assistance Dog or a dog undergoing such training are welcome to visit this site.

Costs

For self-guided visitors, entry is by donation (suggested donation is \$5 per person or \$50 per class). Museum programs are \$150 for each class up to 35 students. This includes *School Days* or *Shipwrecks & Whalers* or *Picture my World – Mapping*.

School programs are available Tuesday, Thursday & Friday between 10:00am and 3:00pm during school terms. Each program runs for 90 minutes, there must be six adults per group/class at all times and maximum of 35 students per group/class.

Museum Manners

Visiting the Museum should be an enjoyable experience.

We try to avoid too many rules, but there are a few 'Museum Manners' we expect visitors to follow. These are for everyone's comfort and safety, and to protect irreplaceable objects and the 130 year-old building.

- You are welcome to talk, laugh, cry, wonder, get excited and be imaginative.
- We ask you not to bring food or drink, or touch objects unless the sign says you can do so.
- Photographs and selfies are welcome, but selfie sticks and commercial photography are not permitted (please 'tag' the Museum if you share your photographs).
